Lance Lewis is currently serving as an adjunct professor in the Department of Social Sciences and Humanities at Northwood University. Over a thirty plus year career in higher education, he served in a variety of administrative positions at Kansas State University, Michigan State University, Cleary University and Northwood University. He has taught undergraduate courses for over twenty years. He most recently served as Provost and Chief Academic Officer at Cleary University from 2015-2019, and also served as Associate Dean and then Dean of International Programs, and Academic Dean at Northwood University from 2000-2014. Lewis earned his doctorate at Michigan State University, master's degrees at Norwich University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, and his bachelor's degree at Kansas State University.
